

In a book published on SAGE Business titled, “Employment and Work” focuses on a variety of issues, but mainly those that the disability community faces in the work environment. In chapter two, titled “Current Issues, Controversies and Solutions,” the authors focus on the current policies in place to help those with disabilities while simultaneously addressing the barriers they face. In the chapter, the authors elaborate on how social security plays into the workplace, and for example what they cover like financial assistance and their at home expenses. They then move on to address how these barriers and possible added duties for those in charge are not needed if the accommodations of the individual with the disability are met. The rest of the chapter is written in a such a way — the authors address the standing policies and institutions that are in place to help those with disabilities and discuss the barriers that workplaces might face. However, they counter this by including how these expenses or added legal action can be avoided by changing simple things and becoming more knowledgeable of the resources that can be used.
