For my next source, I utilized a magazine article titled "Pushing harder on disability inclusion" written in the Baltimore Jewish Times. This article focuses on the recent past presidential election, and what each candidate included on disability inclusion. While including both parties, the author explains how some candidates included disability rights in their campaign, which has rarely been brought up or acknowledged before. In writing this article, the author uses disability rights as something that blurs the line between democratic and republican, and how those candidates are acknowledging that the disability community requires more attention and help. The author then compares the 2016 election campaigns to when Franklin D. Roosevelt was in office, and hid his disability. He uses this sentiment in order to highlight how times have changed, but that change still needs to happen.

I included this source as I thought it added another perspective to my argument. The author himself is the president of the Ruderman Family Foundation which is centered on incorporating those with disabilities into society. He offers recent data, and uses it to highlight how the disability community has come a long way in terms of the public eye. This article is useful as it calls us to action, and creates awareness of the issues at hand regarding individuals with disabilities.
