In the TedTalk titled, "Why Design Should Include Everyone" Sinead Burke gives her first hand experiences as someone who lives in a world that isn't always disability friendly. Being that she is genetically shorter that someone of her age group, she discusses her struggles in a world built for those of the norm. Her struggle to live a normal life is constricted by clothing, and even being able to use the bathroom. She focuses her speech on how her inability to do daily things with ease has allowed her to see how important design is in inclusion.

I plan to use this point to drive the reality of the situation at hand. People with disabilities can not find luxury in the mindless things we do everyday, and how important it is to design for everyone, because like stated before, everyone benefits. Burke's experiences will emphasize what I have already been saying, and truly show how important these things are.
