The tools I used when "Complicating Research" and finding new perspectives for my research topic were Sage Knowledge along with hyperlinks from online publications. I also subject searched and looked through sources bibliographies to find cited works.

One new perspective that I found came from following a hyperlink on an online publication. Since this hyperlink was in an article that I already chose to add to the discussion I knew the topic was somehow related, and when I looked into that link deeper I saw that it could add a new perspective. Another article I found through works cited in a bibliography is a scholarly journal from 1997. Both of the sources I found added a new perspective on diversity training and empathy not always having a positive outcome, adding to the discussion about what the best way to become inclusive is.

Using these tools helped me branch out in my research. I especially found analyzing hyperlinks and looking through cited worked to be a helpful tip because I had never thought to do that before. Looking at what the authors reference made it easier for my research to stay on the topic since they each had a direct correlation to one another.
