Intersectionality between sexuality/ gender and socioeconomic status is the main concept of "Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender PERSONS & Socioeconomic Status.", a publication by the American Psychological Association. Financial statistics relating to Queer individuals and the disjuncture between those who do not identify as members of the LGBTQIA+ community are presented. The connection between low socioeconomic status and mental health are also explored. Additionally, The root of these problems is made clear in the analysis of various LGBTQIA+ "support" programs and the marginalizing of queer youth. Lastly, the legal barriers that prohibit LGBTQIA+ people have to face when trying to improve their financial situation are connected back to the systemic oppression of individual expression through sexual orientation and gender identity.

I chose to include this text in my portfolio because of its significance in demonstrating the impact that being a member of the LGBTQIA+ community can have on your socioeconomic status and mental health as a result of workplace culture. Although the statistics in this text do not clearly outline the connection between gender/sexuality and the perception of these characteristics in corporate America, I believe they demonstrate the consequences.
